Discussion on issues relating to delay in investigation and trial.

RESOLUTION:-


1. The Joint Director has apprised the committee that he has cleared the backlogs of all pending M/L reports and also streamlined the process of issuing the reports. The Superintendent of Police informed that on receipt of all pending M.L. reports F/F in all those cases have been submitted to the court.
2. The Joint Director of Health Services, Golaghat informed the members that summon to the Doctors are still being issued without the case number and the name of the victims for which the Doctors find it difficult to trace out the record so as to update him to adduce evidence in the Court. The members resolved to ask the Public Prosecutor, Golaghat and the Addl. P.P. and A.P.P. under his control, to issue summon to witnesses mentioning the case numbers and also the name of the victim may also be mentioned in the summons issued to the Doctors.
3. The District Judge insisted upon the S.P. Golaghat to follow the provision of section 27 Evidence Act in its letter and spirit while recording statement of accused leading to discovery. The Superintendent of Police assured that he will issue necessary instruction to all the I.O to follow the same.

4. The District Judge also insisted upon examination of the victim girls/women of sexual offences preferably by a lady Doctor. The Joint Director of Health Services informed the members that sufficient numbers of lady Doctors are not available in the Civil Hospitals and, therefore, it would not be possible to get all the victims examined by lady Doctor, but he assured that as far as possible the task will be assigned to the available lady Doctors.
5. The members also discussed about treating G.D. Entry as FIR, following the required formalities, and sending the same to the Magistrate, without any delay. The Superintendent of Police informed that he will look into the matter.
